We Encourage You to Recycle!

- Did you know that yard waste presents you with one of the greatest recycling opportunities? 50% of the waste that goes into the landfill in the growing months of the year is recyclable organic material — grass clippings, leaves and brush. You can recycle your grass clippings by leaving the clippings on the ground when you mow. This also helps retain water in vour lawn.
- Pickup is every other week, typically on the same day as your trash pickup. Recycling must be placed curbside by 7:00 A.M., even if trash is picked up in alley, as our recycle truck will not go into the alley. If your area is an exception, you will be made aware of that.
- We make it easy to recycle! Our single stream recycling program allows you to co-mingle your recycling in one container. You can mix together plastic bottles, glass bottles and jars, metal cans and paper items in the same bin. They will be sorted at the recycling center.
- 96-gallon recycle carts with wheels are available from Republic Services for a minimal charge. Call our Customer Service Center at (303) 286-1200 to order.
- You are welcome to use personal containers in addition to at least one of ours. Make sure additional containers are clearly marked Recycle. Stickers are available from Customer Service.
- You can recycle motor oil and car batteries at most auto parts stores.


- Recycle your televisions, electronics, and computer monitors through MeTech Recycling (720) 377-7700 or Electronic Recyclers International Inc. 1-800-884-8466.
- Paper: Newspapers and inserts, magazines, telephone books, junk mail, office paper.
- Cardboard: Flattened, bundled, cut down to fit in container. For large cardboard removal, please bundle in 3 foot cubes and call one business day prior to your service day.
- Aluminum: Beverage cans, aluminum foil, pie tins, etc
- Steel: Tin cans, including cans from vegetables, fruit, soup, pet food, coffee and aerosol.
- Glass Bottles & Jars: Clear and colored glass bottles and jars. Please do not include any window glass, drinking glasses, mirrors, or any glass that is not a bottle or jar.
- Plastic #1 #7: Look for the recycling numbers 1-7 on the household item.


Labels do not have to be removed.

No plastic bags.



Welcome To Republic Services! Tips on Trash

Please have your trash and recycling out by 7:00 A.M. on your day of service to guarantee your pick-up.

Republic owned containers are available for a nominal usage fee.

Please bag all trash and place it in a closed container to protect it from weather, insects and animals. Securely bagging your trash helps keep your community neat on windy days.

Due to normal wear and tear of customer owned containers, replacement is not the responsibility of Republic Services.

Included in service is our 96-gallon cart and up to 7 bags on the side. Should the limit be exceeded, extra bags will be charged \$3.00 each. Drivers are required to pick up all trash on the curb. If you do not want to be charged extra please only set out the limit.

Branches and brush need to be cut into 4-foot lengths and securely tied into 18-inch diameter bundles less than 50 pounds. Each bundle would replace one bag of trash.

For our drivers' health and safety, we will not take containers that weigh more than 50 pounds.

If you need to dispose of glass or mirror, they must be wrapped, taped and marked to protect yourselves and our drivers.

Make sure that children's toys and bikes (or any item not intended for collection) are not placed near trash or recycle. Items cannot be recovered once they are in the trash truck.

Cardboard boxes must be empty, flattened and bundled no larger than 3 foot cubes. No more than 3 bundles per week

UNACCEPTABLE waste items include: hazardous waste, medical waste, electronics and liquids.

Contact your county health department for disposal of hazardous & medical waste such as oil, gas, wet paint, tires, insecticide, fertilizer, vehicle batteries, household batteries, propane tanks, fire extinguishers, ammunition, fireworks, refrigerators, air conditioners, freezers and items containing Freon, sharps and unused medication.

Water based paint must be completely dry before disposing in the trash. It can be absorbed by clean kitty litter or pouring over newspaper and sitting until dry. Once dry or solid, remove the lids and set the cans next to the trash.

Electronic items such as computers, televisions, etc. see Recycle Guidelines on back of brochure.

Please empty liquid from all containers before placing in the trash.

Large items such as carpet rolls, furniture or appliances are considered bulk and are charged additionally. Please do not have items out for donation on the same day as collection day.

Carpet will be charged at the bulk rate per roll and need to be cut into 4 foot lengths. To avoid bulk charges for carpet remnants, please place in your trash cans or bags.

Hazardous Waste and Medical Waste

- Hypodermic needles in the trash pose a health hazard to you, your family, and our drivers. Please place old needles, razor blades, or any sharp items into a hard plastic container like a laundry detergent bottle with a screw on lid and place in with your other regular trash. Do not recycle the bottle! Any unsecured medical waste or hazardous items will not be taken.
- These counties and cities have facilities or hazardous household waste collection days where county residents can take many of the items that are unacceptable for trash collection.
