Hazardous Waste and Medical Waste

- Hypodermic needles in the trash pose a health hazard to you, your family, and our drivers. Please place old needles, razor blades, or any sharp items into a hard plastic container like a laundry detergent bottle with a screw on lid. Place the tightly sealed container in with your other regular trash. Do not recycle the Bottle!

We Encourage You to Recycle!

- Did you know that yard waste presents you with one of the greatest recycling opportunities? 50% of the waste that goes into the landfill in the growing months of the year is recyclable organic material grass clippings, leaves and brush. You can recycle your grass clippings by leaving the clippings on the ground when you mow. This also helps retain water in your lawn.
- Pickup is every other week, typically on the same day as your trash pickup. Generally, recycling must be placed on the curbside even if trash is picked up in alley, as our recycle truck will not go into the alley. If your area is an exception, you will be made aware of that.
- We make it easy to recycle! Our single stream recycling program allows you to co-mingle your recycling in one container. You can mix together plastic bottles, glass bottles and jars, metal cans and paper items in the same bin. They will be sorted at the recycling center.
- Poly carts are available from Republic Services for a charge. Call our customer service center to order.
- You are welcome to use other receptacles purchased from discount and hardware stores in addition to at least one of ours. Make sure your Allied Waste / Republic Services poly cart is placed out in front so our driver will see it and make sure your recycling is clearly marked.
- You can recycle motor oil and car batteries at most Checker Auto Parts and Pep Boys Stores.
- Do not place your yard waste in leaf bags as those will not be emptied and returned.

Republic Services Recycle Guidelines:

- Recycle your televisions, electronics, and computer monitors through MeTech Recycling at (720) 377-7700.
- Newspapers: Newspapers and the inserts that come in the paper are fine. Also, magazines, junk mail, phone books and white and colored paper.
- Aluminum beverage cans: Soft drinks, beer cans, aluminum pet food cans, aluminum foil, pie tins and other cans are also okay, but please rinse them out first.
- Steel food cans: Also known as tin cans, these include cans from vegetables, fruit, soup and coffee. Leave the labels on, but please rinse them out first. Aerosol cans are also acceptable.
- Glass bottles and jars: Food jars, beer bottles, soft drinks and wine bottles are fine. You may leave the labels on, but please remove the lids and rinse food containers. Please do not include any window glass, drinking glasses or any glass that is not a bottle or jar.
- Most plastic: Soft drink, milk, juice, detergent and shampoo bottles can be recycled. Look for the recycling numbers 1-7 on the bottom of the bottle. You may leave on any labels, but please remove the lids. Please do not include oil, pesticide or hazardous material bottles. No plastic bags.

Tips on Trash
Please have your trash and recycling out by 7:00 A.M. on your day of service to guarantee your pick-up.
Please bag all trash and place it in a closed container to protect it from weather, insects and animals. Securely bagging your trash helps keep your community neat on windy days.
If your trash exceeds any variation of 10 32-gallon cans or bags of household trash, yard waste or bundles of twigs; please call in to schedule a special pick-up 24 hours prior to your regular service day.
More than 10 bags / bundles will be charged at a rate of \$3 each.
For our drivers' health and safety, we will not take containers that weigh more than 50 pounds.
Branches and brush need to be cut into 4-foot lengths and securely tied into 18-inch diameter bundles. Up to a combined amount of ten bags and bundles are allowed each week.
If you need to dispose of glass or mirror, they must be wrapped, taped and marked to protect yourselves and our drivers.
Make sure that children's toys and bikes (or any item not intended for collection) are not placed near trash or recycle. Items cannot be recovered once they are in the trash truck.
We will take moving boxes as trash or recycling that have been flattened and bundled in sections no larger than 3' x 3' (no more than 3 bundles per week).
Boxes are not an approved trash receptacle and our drivers have been instructed not to pick them up. Please contain trash in appropriate trash cans or bags.
Oil, gas, wet paint, tires, insecticide, fertilizer, vehicle batteries, household batteries, propane tanks, fire extinguishers, ammunition, fireworks, computer equipment, electronic items, televisions, cast iron, medical waste, refrigerators, air conditioners, freezers and items containing Freon are UNACCEPTABLE waste items. Please contact your county health department for disposal of such items.
Please empty liquid from containers before putting the containers in the trash. Clean kitty litter may be used to dry unused water based paint. Once kitty litter has dried, place the cans alongside of the trash can with the lids off.
Large items such as carpet rolls, furniture or appliances are considered bulk. To arrange for removal of such items, please call our customer service center 24-hours in advance of your collection day. We will quote and request pre-payment accordingly at time of call-in.
Carpet will be charged at the bulk rate per roll and need to be cut into 4 foot lengths. To avoid bulk charges for carpet remnants, please place in your trash cans or bags
