

### COVENANT CORNER

#### **SUMMER EDITION**

Soon we will all be busy with our summer time activities, vacations and weekend getaways just a reminder of a few summer time common violations:

- **RECREATIONAL VEHICLES:** Recreational vehicles, campers, trailers, boats, jet skis, etc. must be kept within the garage or suitably screened from view, unless you are loading or unloading (24 hours). If you are packing for an extended trip and need additional time please contact Vista Management to let us know in advance.
- INOPERABLE VEHICLES: No maintenance of Vehicles and no inoperable vehicles of any kind shall be stored or parked on the properties. No activity such as maintenance, repair or rebuilding, dismantling, repainting or servicing of any vehicles may be conducted on the properties, unless it is done within an enclosed structure.
- YARD MAINTENANCE: Weekly mowing, weeding, trimming and pruning are necessary. It is possible that aging landscape may need extra attention to help with weed control and

- trimming. If you are having trouble with excessive weeds in planting/rock beds, consider replacing the weed barrier fabric as a solution.
- PET PICK-UP: People are expected to pick up after their pet so when you are out on a stroll with your furry friend please remember to bring a bag or use bags from provided doggie bag stations in the community and remove that poop. Thank you to those pet owners that clean up after their pets.
- ADVERTISING SIGNS: No advertising or signs of any character shall be erected, placed or permitted or maintained on any lot, except for "For Sale, Open House or For Rent".
- TRASH AND MATERIALS: No garbage, trash, lumber, grass, shrubs or tree clippings, plant waste ... shall be kept, stored or allowed to accumulate on the properties unless placed in a suitable container and shall not be exposed unless it is trash pick-up day.

#### RED, WHITE & BLUE SALSA

A FRESH AND FRUITY SALSA WITH A NICE CRUNCH! PERFECT FOR THE 4TH OF JULY ... OR ANY SUMMER DAY!

Yield: About 3 cups salsa Prep Time: 5 minutes Total Time: 5 minutes

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 cup fresh blueberries 1 cup diced strawberries 1 cup diced jicama 1/3 cup chopped cilantro 1/4 cup finely chopped red onion 2 tablespoons finely chopped jalapeno pepper, stemmed and seeded Juice of 1 large lime Salt, to taste

Tortilla chips, for serving

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

In a medium bowl, combine blueberries, strawberries, jicama, cilantro, red onion, jalapeno, and lime juice. Stir until well combined. Season with salt, to taste. Serve with tortilla chips at room temperature or chilled.

Note: This salsa is also great with grilled fish or chicken. It is best eaten the day it is made.



#### PATRIOT FLAG

SWEET & SALTY REFRESHINGLY DELIGHTFUL TREAT!

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- Half of a seedless watermelon
- 8 ounces of feta cheese
- 1 pint of blueberries

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

Cut and cube half of a seedless watermelon. Cube 8 ounces of feta. Rinse off 1 pint of fresh blueberries. Pour blueberries into a bowl, preferably square and place in the top left corner of a rectangle (or oval) platter. Assemble watermelon and feta into rows, starting with the watermelon. Serve with a side of toothpicks for easy and healthy handling of the food.
